#### 2016 Sailing Season is over...now we wait for 2017.

In 2016 BHYC organized:

- 38 Club Series Races
- 9 weekend regatta days
- 8 Cruising events
- RC participated in GHYRA, Easter Seals, OYS & Oakville Club

This year we had 41 boats registered for the Club Racing Series, which is a slight drop from previous years. Bronte Rocks also experienced a decrease in enrolment for various reasons. But overall, our numbers are still healthy although we would all like to grow more.

All this was possible because of a dedicated group of volunteers in Sailing, Racing and Bronte Rocks committee. More than 40 people participated in Race Committee and spent more than 800 hours on the water.

This year we introduced a new program, RC Skipper. Overall it was success. Many of you helped organize the running of our club races and I hope this program will continue to be important in the future. We also added a few new website pages about racing and I hope it made registering for events and getting information about events easier than in the past.

It was my privilege to serve as Rear Commodore of Sail for the last two years. I will be stepping down to allow new people with new ideas to take over.

I would like to extend my gratitude to all members that helped me to fill this role, without your help it wouldn't be impossible.

#### Association of Oakville Harbours Stakeholders activities - Fall 2016

The Association of Oakville Harbours' Stakeholders (AOHS) is a volunteer group comprised of representatives of the users of Oakville harbours including anglers, canoeists and paddlers, as well as the sailors, power boaters and TOWARF. AOHS liaises with the Town of Oakville to provide input that represents the interests of the stakeholders. AOHS meets regularly with Town staff on harbour matters, attends the Mayor's breakfast meetings, hosts open houses for the public on significant harbour-related issues and has made presentations to Town Council on harbour matters.

**Harbours Master Plan (HMP)**: As most people are aware, the Town had engaged a consultant to develop a long-term vision and harbours master plan (HMP) for both Oakville and Bronte Harbours that includes, among other objectives, a potential site for a new marina. AOHS had provided input to the studies terms of reference.

The Town hosted a public information workshop on May 3, and several AOHS representatives attended and provided input. AOHS also met separately with the consultant team. The Town had also invited residents and harbour users to participate in an online survey (which has now ended). Currently Town staff have revised the HMP process and will be separating out the issue of a new marina from other harbour issues in their submission to Council, once the HMP study is completed.

**Harbour Services**: AOHS met with Town staff to revise the process of setting rates and fees for harbour services, with a view to reducing the complexity of the rate structure. In 2017, harbour fees will increase by 3% and dredging fees portion by 5%. As for the rate structure, the number of individual rates has been reduced significantly.

AOHS has requested that the Town replace the flags that were removed from the western hill of Sixteen Mile Creek Outer Harbour (Town staff are considering this).

AOHS has also discussed the bylaw banning use of barbecues on boats in the harbours (the bylaw will not change) and has recommended that the pay phone at Bronte Harbour remain in place for safety/emergency reasons.

AOHS has requested that payment for pump outs be made simpler (currently boaters in Sixteen Mile Creek have to go to the ticket machine in the parking lot on the west side of the creek before taking their boats to the pump out facility on the east side).

**Metro Marine**: The Town had designated Metro Marine in Bronte Harbour as a heritage building. Currently there is only one tenant and the future use is unclear. AOHS favours removing the designation, so the building can become more functional for harbour uses.

#### **OVERALL**


