

IN MEMORY OF ERIC WIKLUND


February 11, 1940 - December 16, 2016

Eric was a engineering graduate of UBC and relocated to Bronte in 1970 when he joined Ontario Hydro. After spending a year or so paddling a canoe up the creek, he was welcomed in to the club by the late Paul Keeley, who was Commodore at that time.

Forty five percent of the BHYC members sailed dinghies in the 1970's and early 80's, with the Wayfarer fleet totalling 22 boats and the Albacores 12. After gaining experience Eric purchased a wooden Wayfarer, later followed by a fibreglass Wayfarer named Hagar. Most of the dinghies were sailed by families and Eric was no exception. Though after rendering his wife nearly unconscious with the boom, Judy passed the crewing duties on to their children. The dinghies and keel boats sailed on the same course based on the Olympic Circle and Eric was known for loudly remonstrating keel boat skippers as to right of way at turning marks. By the 90's the dinghy fleets had virtually disappeared, and Eric sold the Wayfarer to concentrate on his other activities such as Scouting and Camping.

Eric served a Rear Commodore Training and was responsible for placing many of the club's old records in PDF computer format. In the days when the Training Division was run as a low cost operation he was one of a team that spent long Winter hours in the Junior Club on the West Bank re-building and rerigging dinghy masts. Latterly he was member of the Committee boat crew until ill health and a failing sense of balance forced him to give it up. Despite not sailing in recent years he retained an interest in the Club, attending some social events and playing darts until last November.

IN MEMORY OF HUGH ROPER

March 5, 1936 - December 22, 2016

Hugh Roper did an enormous amount of work for the Club, and did it quietly without any fuss. One of the largest projects he took on was refurbishing the Sailing School coach boat "Fetchit". Hugh worked on "Fetchit", and another group worked on "Coaching". Both boats had their useful lives extended by several years,

Hugh also served on the Board as Vice Commodore back in the time when we owned the docks on the west side of the creek, so not only, had he to arrange for boats to be lifted, but had to twist arms to get a work party together to haul the docks and make any necessary repairs. Not an easy task, but he got it done.

He was also an advocate for the "Lightning" class – a 19' dinghy which had a large following at one time, and he organized an annual regatta for the Club Lightnings and any others on the lake that were interested. For many years, even after he bought his CS 27 "Nancy O" he maintained an interest in Lightnings, and the last time I saw his garage/workshop, there were still two of the dinghies in it.
