

We had a successful Learn to Sail open house on the 7th of April, registration is going well, and we are at about the same level as last year. The club was successful in getting a grant for some of the instructor wages from the Federal Government which will help the Sailing School financial situation significantly.

We are in the process of preparing the C420 dinghies and some of the coach boats for use by the Ontario Sailing Association for their Instructor Training program which starts on the weekend of the 5-6th of May. This program will be operating out of the club until the end of June except for the Sail Past weekend and provides another welcome source of income for the club.

The racing team will start training during the second week of May and there are two regattas which the team will enter at the end of the month. We have received delivery of our new Zim C420.

We will be running the Home School Program during the month of June where youngsters who are home schooled learn to sail in Optis two afternoons per week for the month.

I would encourage any members who have children or teenagers (includes grandchildren, nephews and nieces) who want to learn to sail to register them in the Learn to Sail program as soon as possible as some of the sessions are almost full already. Don't forget to get the code for the member's discount of 15% which can be obtained by talking to myself, Ally Dandy our head coach or is kept behind the bar.

Proposals from a number of audit firms were received following the issuance of a Request for Proposal. A motion was made at the spring meeting to change auditors for the 2018 year end and approved by the members.

We are in the process of reconciling volunteer hours worked to the membership requirements for 2017. Any members who appear to be short hours will be contacted prior to being issued an invoice. As a reminder all membership categories with the exception of Junior, Crew and Out of Town are required to volunteer 25 hour per year or pay \$35/hr.

Added Features at this Year's Event

New this Year! - Fire Extinguisher Inspection and Certification

Bring your fire extinguisher to our flare day and have them inspected and certified on site for \$5.00 per unit by Fire Alert (<u>WWW.FIRE-ALERT.CA</u>), a qualified fire extinguisher inspection, service and maintenance firm.

If your fire extinguisher is more than 6 years old, the National Fire Code of Canada requires the unit to be inspected internally, recharged and certified. If it is 12 years old, a "hydrostatic" pressure test is required. Fire Alert will be able to do these inspections/tests on site and have your older unit certified, often for less than buying new one.

You can find the year of manufacture stamped on the metal base of the fire extinguisher or in the label on the side of your unit. Inspecting and certifying your fire extinguishers will help ensure they will operate properly when you need them!!

Boating Skills Virtual Trainer

This was a big hit last year and it will prove to be so again this year. Come and try your hand at the wheel through several challenging modules including: docking, slalom course and trailering your boat. This simulator is sure to test your skill and ability.

CORMEAL CASSEROLE (Kristen Rowley)

1/2 cup melted butter

- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 (8.5 ounce) package dry corn bread mix
- 1 (15 ounce) can whole kernel corn, drained
- 1 (14.75 ounce) can creamed corn
- 1 cup sour cream

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F and lightly grease a 9x9 inch baking dish. In a medium bowl, combine butter, eggs, corn bread mix, whole and creamed corn and sour cream - spoon mixture into prepared dish. Bake for 45 minutes in the preheated oven, or until the top is golden brown As sailing (and racing!) season approaches, you might want to take advantage of various menus that our local restaurants offer. 
