First of all, a final reminder for everyone to remove their cradle pads and bits, ladders, boarding steps, winter cover frames, furling support boards, etc. from the yard. Any items left in the yard by the middle of June are going to be thrown out.

We are still trying to identify which vessels, trailers, dinghies have paid for storage and which have not.

We also still need to get rid of Mega (departure date has been promised as June 15), the Shark trailer in the parking lot (in regular contact with the owner) and one cradle (should be leaving this week). One cradle is to be made collapsible (the owner has promised to take care of this asap).

All the wet moorings have been rented out for the season. If you need a set of boarding steps, there is a set that has been donated by a generous member. The steps are currently located in the yard at the upper pedestrian gate to the Town's yard.

I still need the owners of the following kayaks/canoes to contact me as soon as possible:

- 1. Pelican sit-on Beige/white Stored in rack B5
- 2. We-No-Nah Orange Stored in rack D1
- Pelican Ram X Green Canoe Stored in rack D2

A low cost solution has been implemented on the garbage enclosure gates so that they don't need to be propped shut with a concrete block. If you have stored anything in the garbage enclosure area, please remove it as it will be put in the bin very shortly.

I would like to get the Gardening committee together in the first week of June to see what we can do with the gardens and deck. A concerted effort will be made to rejuvenate the lawn as well.

The area around crane has been repayed by the Town. A new weather-proof control pendant has been installed on the lower hoist (dry sailors, hoist) and the annual crane inspection was carried out at the same time. Mast Crane training to be carried out in the next month or so.



# Chicken is Here!

Chicken is here! We have farm raised chicken available in pieces. Frozen and vacuum sealed. Contact us to send a price list and availability. We will be doing a group of full chickens later this summer. Taking orders for pork halves and wholes as well as lamb halves and wholes. Pork half is about three wine boxes and half lamb is about one. They will be ready in the fall and can be custom cut.

Chicken dry rub: you can either put the rub on at home and keep in a zip lock bag or mix it and put it on before grilling (or baking or frying). Mix 1tsp paprika, 1 tsp cumin, 1 tsp onion powder, 1\2 tsp garlic powder, 1\4 black pepper, 1\2 tsp seasoning salt and 1/8 cayenne powder (optional). Brush chicken with olive oil or even just pat on dry. Does enough for two chicken breasts or similar. Adjust spices to your own personal taste.


### **DON HARKNESS Treasurer**


