The majority of boats have been covered and are waiting for us to start preparation in the Spring. The mobile crane has been booked for April 27, 2019. That means that Launch 2019 is scheduled for that date so you can start to plan your 2019 boat preparation and season.

Please remember to keep extension cords unplugged when you are not on Board and come down from time to time to see how your boats are doing. A number of covers are already looking like they have been through a hurricane. If you see another boat that needs attention, please notify me or the owner. Please make sure that your ladders do not impede your neighbours in the yard and remember to tie off the top of your ladder to a stanchion, push pit, winch, etc., to avoid it falling down when you climbing on or off your boat.

We now have a jack with the ability to lift 8000lb, which should cover a corner of most cradles in the yard. If you think your cradle needs to be levelled differently, please feel free to contact me and we will see what we can do. We were successful in doing one boat already.

An appeal to everyone. If you see that the garbage cans are getting full, please go find another member to help you and empty the bin into the garbage dumpster. It takes no time and saves the certain members from having doing it time and again.










News Around the Club


Congratulations to Dawn Greville winner of the Silent Service Award for 2018, which is presented to a club member who has quietly helped make the club a better place, always working behind the scene.

PHIL GELSHEIMER House Director

The theme for House during November was safety and security. The month kicked off with a Red Cross First Aid and CPR training course. It was attended by both bar staff and club members, so you can feel just a little safer as you go about your activities at the club.

Food safety is also paramount and during the month our kitchen refrigerator failed. As this was discovered only after several days, the food in it had to be thrown out. Given its age it was deemed better to replace the fridge rather than repair it. Now we have a lovely new large fridge that also has an audible alarm should the temperature inside ever become unsafe to store food.

In terms of security, ADT was chosen to continue providing alarm monitoring. In renewing their contract, they agreed to update our alarm keypad and panel. The new panel is cellular based and allows the ability to monitor the alarm status remotely on a mobile phone or web browser. The club can now easily manage access to the alarm system as each individual has their own code. Please remember this if you had a code from prior years as it no longer works, and you'll set the alarm off.

Continuing the aspect of security, the club has purchased a new high definition security camera system, one with enough cameras to include the yard and parking lot in its coverage. Like all things these days, it can also send images to mobile phones so remote monitoring will be possible. Any incidents can be easily captured to a USB drive and shared with authorities. Installation will begin in December.

We've had some changes behind the bar, as Sharon got a full-time job at the hospital and will no longer be working at BHYC. The club wishes her much success in her new role! We're pleased to announce we have two new bartenders joining us, Filip Opacic and Michael Hassard. Filip and Michael are also sailors, as Filip has a boat moored at Bronte, and Michael sails with him. Both are excited to be working at a yacht club and look forward to talking with you about all things sailing.



Chicken is Here!

Chicken is here! We have farm raised chicken available in pieces. Frozen and vacuum sealed. Contact us to send a price list and availability. We will be doing a group of full chickens later this summer. Taking orders for pork halves and wholes as well as lamb halves and wholes. Pork half is about three wine boxes and half lamb is about one. They will be ready in the fall and can be custom cut.

Chicken dry rub: you can either put the rub on at home and keep in a zip lock bag or mix it and put it on before grilling (or baking or frying). Mix 1tsp paprika, 1 tsp cumin, 1 tsp onion powder, 1\2 tsp garlic powder, 1\4 black pepper, 1\2 tsp seasoning salt and 1/8 cayenne powder (optional). Brush chicken with olive oil or even just pat on dry. Does enough for two chicken breasts or similar. Adjust spices to your own personal taste.


