Association of Oakville Harbours' Stakeholders – with your interests in mind

AOHS was formed circa 2011, in the wake of the Town of Oakville's funded "Oakville Harbours Financial Strategic Business Plan" (aka "the Hemson Report" named after the eponymous consulting firm) and in the absence of any entity representing the interests of boaters and other stakeholders with interests in the sustainable development of our much-valued harbours. Earlier, the Town had scuttled the Oakville Harbours Advisory Committee (OHAC), along with a number of other such committees designed in theory to provide the Town with insight and advice on community issues. With the demise of OHAC, we wanted to make sure that boaters and kindred spirits had a voice in Council and with Town staff, starting with the Hemson Report.

AOHS is a volunteer driven organization. Active members include representatives from: Bronte Harbour Yacht Club; The Oakville Club; Oakville Yacht Squadron; Oakville Power Boat Club; Burloak Canoe Club; Wai Nui Outrigger; Halton Region Salmon & Trout Association; TOWARF; Bronte Outer Harbour Marina Boaters Association

Over past years, AOHS has tackled numerous issues: sediment management; provisions for safety within the harbours; docking and other fees; comparison of service offerings with other Lake Ontario marinas; harbour capacity, both present and future; and much more. At all times an overriding objective has been to maintain open and productive channels of communications with the Town in order that we may bring matters of concern to the attention of elected officials and staff – and strive to make sure these are addressed and hopefully resolved. In recent times, the focus has been our desire to see the drafting of a Harbours Master Plan that lays out a vision and a strategy for the maintenance of our existing harbours and the development of additional capacity to meet future demand. It has been a long and arduous journey, but we remain hopeful.

AOHS meets on a monthly basis (summer excepted) with meetings rotating within member clubs.

Outstanding Achievement for Bronte Harbour Yacht Club member Adrian Hanley



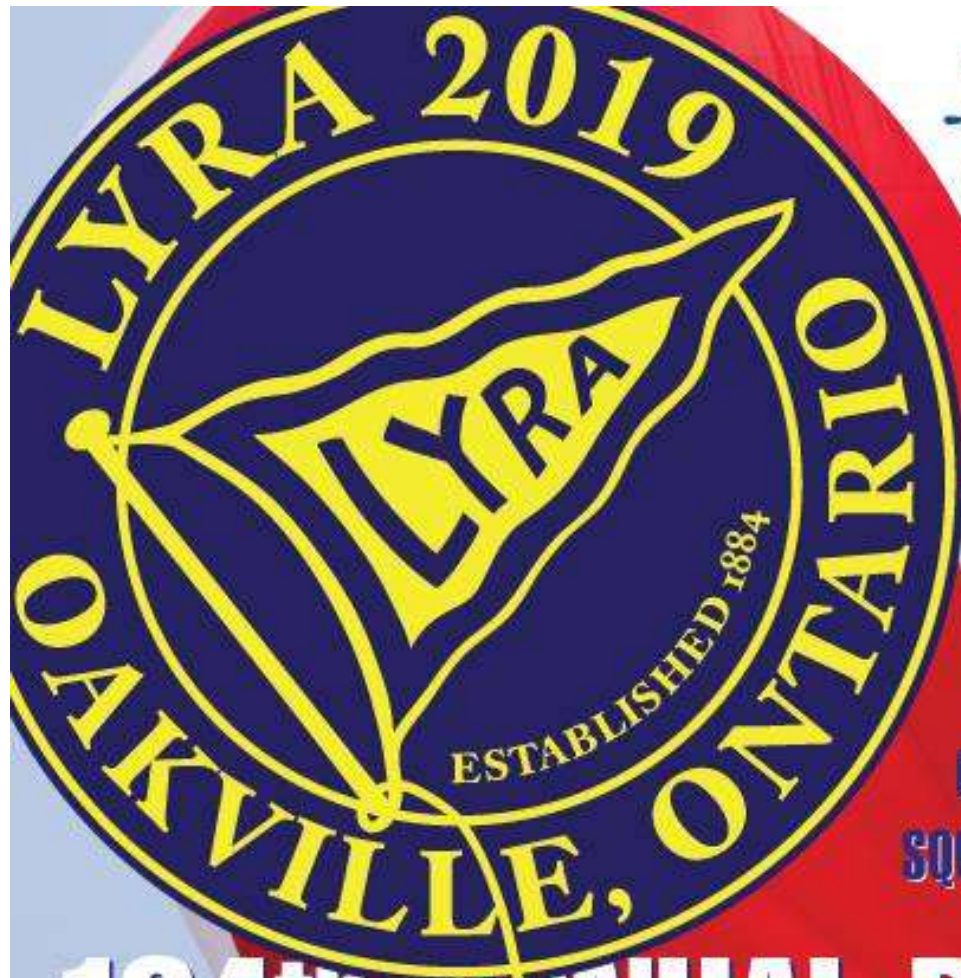

Of note plans include the installation of a bow/fore deck plate to attach a windlass and anchor guide on. A flag system is to be installed as well as testing and updating of electronics as required.

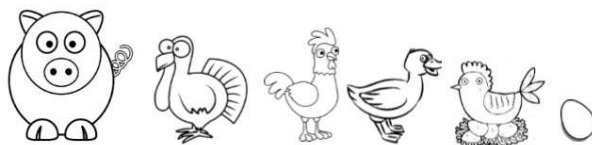

Chicken is Here!

Chicken is here! We have farm raised chicken available in pieces. Frozen and vacuum sealed. Contact us to send a price list and availability. We will be doing a group of full chickens later this summer. Taking orders for pork halves and wholes as well as lamb halves and wholes. Pork half is about three wine boxes and half lamb is about one. They will be ready in the fall and can be custom cut.

Chicken dry rub: you can either put the rub on at home and keep in a zip lock bag or mix it and put it on before grilling (or baking or frying). Mix 1tsp paprika, 1 tsp cumin, 1 tsp onion powder, 1\2 tsp garlic powder, 1\4 black pepper, 1\2 tsp seasoning salt and 1\8 cayenne powder (optional). Brush chicken with olive oil or even just pat on dry. Does enough for two chicken breasts or similar. Adjust spices to your own personal taste.

Phil Brimacombe has provided details of the Oakville marine history collection which can be viewed at 110 King St, Oakville, ON L6J 1B1. Perhaps this is an outing for one of these cold winter days, Phil describes the collection as follows:

Separate awards will be given for all the individual races, which are spread over a full week.

Peter Kirkwood is in the process of setting up a committee to be responsible for off- the-water activities in Bronte during the regatta and is actively searching for a dock master team to look after directing, welcoming, and docking all the visiting boats. Bronte Rocks preparations are underway, at present most of the emphasis is on securing sponsors and Barbara Keeley-Watt has a report on the regatta in the publicity section of the Signal.

In preparation for our club racing season, the sail Committee will be reviewing NOR and Sailing instructions for issuing in March and registration will open in April.

CRUISING Mike Paulson

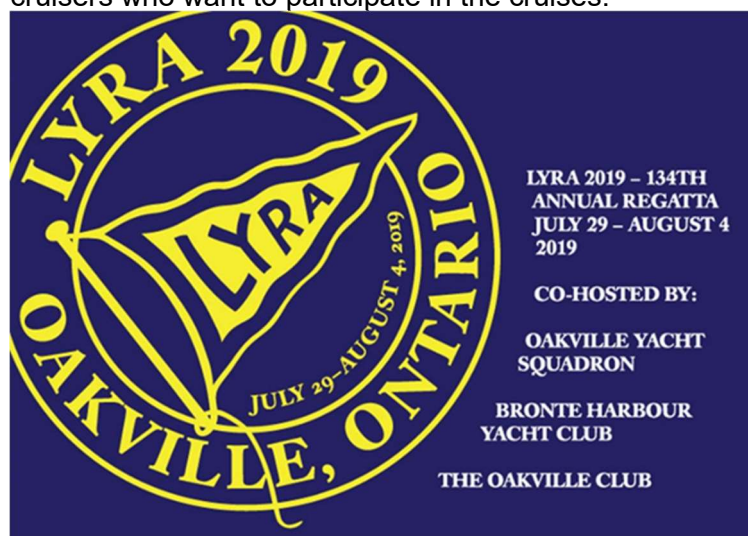
Well here we are in the middle of winter and as I am writing this, we are battling the snow storm of the winter so far!!
