Is it just me who is wondering where the first month of this year went? Launch will be here before we even know it.

Speaking of Launch, we are having a change to many years of tradition. Instead of launching on a weekend we are going to be launching on a Monday. To be exact, Monday, May 4, 2020. The reasons for this are:

The Town will still be laying down the tires and anchors, which make up the Mediterranean moorings, on the weekend of May 2 and May 3 – the weekend that we traditionally use for Launch. The anchors were removed because of the dredging that is taking place in the inner harbour.

We don't want to launch our boats on the following weekend because the chances are good that we may have another year of flooding. During the last two floods (2017 and 2019), the water levels rose fast in the week following Launch. This resulted in many boat owners being unable to use the crane to step their masts because there was nothing to tie their boats off to during the mast stepping operation.

Thank you to those who have already volunteered to work on the Monday. I will post the signup sheet on the lower notice board, the one closest to the bottom of the steps leading from the lower level to the front lobby in the coming week. Please add your names to empty positions as soon as you can.

Applications and payments for the Club moorings, dry-sailing, storage of kayaks, canoes, etc. will be posted online by the end of the first week of February.

We also aim to have the two sections of our roof that have failed repaired this month.

Busy Bees for Australian Wildlife

SIP 'N STITCH

BUSY BEES FOR AUSTRALIAN WILDLIFE

Canada and Australia are often considered to be “sister nations” of the British Commonwealth; we have so much in common. Like so many others around the world, Canadians have watched as bushfires have swept across parts of Australia, destroying acres of habitat and killing millions of animals.

In early January, Denise (our daughter, who lives with her family in Australia) sent information about assisting Australia Wildlife Rescue with animals who had been injured or orphaned in the fires. Immediately, I sent out an email to members of the Tuesday night “Sip 'n Stitch” group saying that I had received information on how to knit or sew nests, pouches and sleeping pads. I barely had sent out the email when they had started.

Within hours, Alex Treiber had researched more information and found more patterns... and sewn her first pouch! Beth Stewart was not far behind her; Beth began a marathon of sewing sleeping pads, all sizes, for displaced and/or injured animals. And it didn't stop there! Pat Dewar, Marion Howard (wife to Peter Howard, our bar manager), Diana Bissonnette, and Mary Ellen Bockler came on board shortly thereafter.

In the space of four days, we'd met up as a group three times to crochet, knit, snip, trim, pin, sew, and iron a variety of creations. From small nests for injured birds and sleeping pads for recovering animals to pouches for various marsupials (kangaroos, koalas, wallabies, etc.), it was a flurry of activity.

Almost all of us continued to work on our projects at home; I am not sure if Alex or Beth even took time to have their meals! On the fourth evening (which was our regular Tuesday night for getting together), we finished up projects (well, most of us did... I think Alex and Beth went home and continued to sew!) and began to put everything together to be taken to a drop off hub.

It's due to Alex and her amazing research skills that we quickly had a contact for a drop off location. To our surprise and excitement, we soon learned that Air Canada had also come on board and that mass shipments would be sent from major Canadian cities to the Australian states badly needing bedding, pads, pouches and nests for the thousands of injured and orphaned animals.

In the end, our hard work paid off! On Wednesday, January 15th, Alex, Beth and I boxed up the 85 pieces that had been sewn, knit, or crocheted; we then delivered these to an address in Burlington. These were then added to a large shipment sent out on January 22nd.

A big thank you to everyone who came out and helped or donated time, fabric, and/or equipment. We are grateful to have been able to play a small role in helping a country that is dealing with so much tragedy.

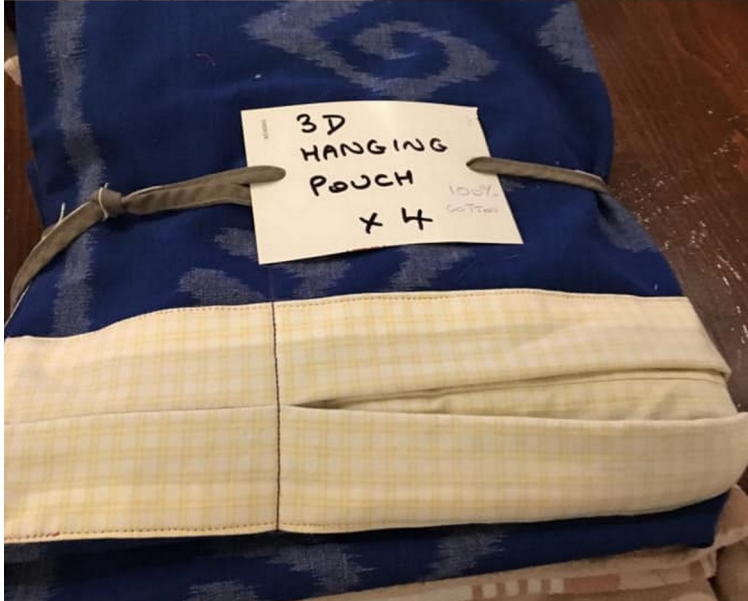
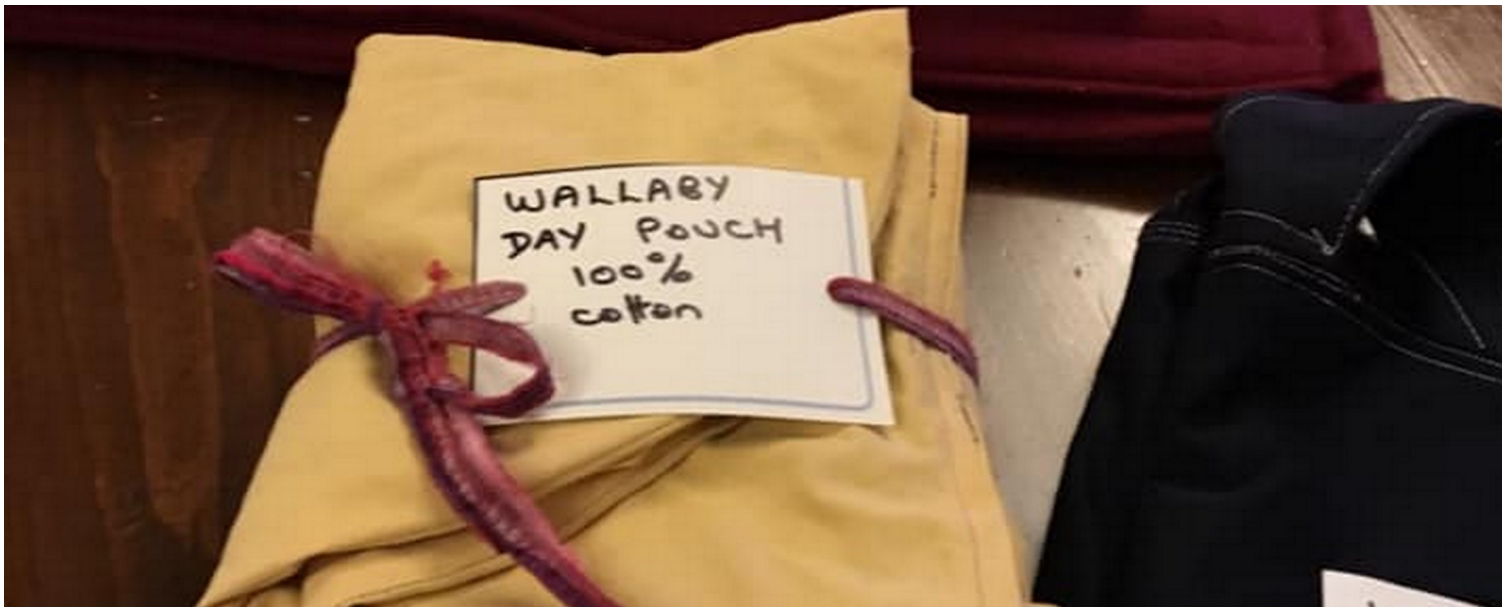

2019 CHAPMAN SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP

If you have a PHRF-LO certificate and compete in a PHRF fleet as part of an interclub event in PHRF-LO waters, you are entered in the Chapman Season Championship.

Brian Chapman was a long-time member of the Technical Committee of PHRF-LO. When he passed away in 2018, PHRF-LO introduced two awards in his name – The Season Championship and the New Racer Award. Awards are given within each PHRF District and an overall award is presented at the PHRF-LO AGM.

You may have seen a list of events on our bulletin board or on the PHRF-LO Website. There are 43 designated events on five bodies of water and this year there were 599 competitors. (If you competed in Bronte Rocks, GHYRA or the OC Regatta for example, you were one of these competitors.) The scoring uses the Chipstead formula, which takes into account your finishing position and the number of boats in your fleet. You can compete in as many events as you want. Your best four event scores are counted for the Championship.

For 2019, the Golden Horseshoe District winners were:

1st place - It's a Conspiracy, Adrian Hanley (BHYC)

2nd place – Pandora, Brian Garrett (BSBC)

3rd place – Snowbird, Mark Quinn (BSBC)

It's a Conspiracy was also the overall PHRF-LO Season Champion. This award was presented at the PHRF-LO Annual General Meeting on February 18. The trophy will be displayed at the Club for a year. Congratulations to Adrian and crew.

Pork half is about three wine boxes and half lamb is about one. They will be ready in the fall and can be custom cut.

Chicken dry rub: you can either put the rub on at home and keep in a zip lock bag or mix it and put it on before grilling (or baking or frying). Mix 1 tsp paprika, 1 tsp cumin, 1 tsp onion powder, 1\2 tsp garlic powder, 1\4 black pepper, 1\2 tsp seasoning salt and 1/8 cayenne powder (optional). Brush chicken with olive oil or even just pat on dry. Does enough for two chicken breasts or similar. Adjust spices to your own personal taste.
