#### PETER WELLS Rear Commodore of Training

With major guidance from Kevin Corcoran (outgoing RC Training), a new Chief Instructor for the Sailing School, Ally Dandy has been hired. Ally has excellent experience having instructed for several years at BHYC. We are in the process of hiring all the instructors as early as possible as there appears to be a potential for a shortage this coming year. Our cost of wages for our staff will rise significantly because of the increase in the minimum wage to \$14 per hour so we have had to raise the cost of classes by a modest \$25 per session.

Details for the racing program are still being finalized but we are investigating the purchase of another almost new 420 to be able to offer fully competitive boats to our racing team.

We have come to an agreement with Sailing Ontario for the use of Club facilities during April, May and June for Instructor Certification Classes. These will take place mainly on weekends except for the launch and Sail Past weekends and provides significant revenue to the club.

Our on-line registration system for all learn to sail classes is expected to be operational during the week of the 9<sup>th</sup> of January with access through the club web site. In addition, if you would like to give sailing lessons as a very special present, you will soon be able to purchase a gift certificate (which can be for any amount) at the bar. This also should be available during the week of the 9<sup>th</sup> of January. There is an early registration discount of \$50 per session for all classes which ends on 1<sup>st</sup> April so please, if you are planning to register your young sailors for a course or more, get your registration in and take advantage of the discount.

We are investigating the purchase of paddle boards so that we will have some on-water diversions for our students when the wind does not co-operate. Any boarding will be strictly up creek so as not to inconvenience members in the restricted area of the boat moorings.

Although it will be a tough act to follow, I am hoping that we can come close to the excellent results both in terms of the number of students trained and the financial return to the club that the Sailing School achieved last year.












# *Remembering* George Thompson 1937 - 2017

#### OBITUARY

It is with great sadness that we report the passing of our good friend George Thompson on Friday December 1st 2018. George was a Life member of BHYC and served in several board positions including Commodore in 1988 and 1989.

Until his MS became disabling, George and Debby were proud owners of Rip II, a C&C Invader that was the first C&C boat built in fibreglass. He and Debby, his wife who predeceased him in 2003, cruised Lake Ontario on Rip II, and in later years George raced Mermaid's Song a Martin 16 a specially adapted boat.

He was active within his church and the local theatre community. George and Debby staged a number of Mystery Dinner Evenings at the BHYC.

Due to poor health, he was unable to drop in at the club, but he kept up to date with all the activities. He was always available to assist with drafting or reviewing Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions in addition to racing rules interpretation. George was a renowned race officer, and trained many of the BHYC race committee volunteers. He was involved with PHRF-LO from shortly after its inception in 1980 and was a Club Handicapper for more than 3 decades. George was Vice-President of PHRF-LO from 1996 to 1997 and President from 1998 to 2000. His discipline and knowledge of race course management will be his legacy at BHYC.

A Celebration of Life Service will take place at Hopedale Presbyterian Church 156 Third Line, Oakville L6L 3Z8 on January 13th 2018 at 11 am.
