








#### Calling ALL Paddlers!

#### Chicken is Here!

Chicken is here! We have farm raised chicken available in pieces. Frozen and vacuum sealed. Contact us to send a price list and availability. We will be doing a group of full chickens later this summer. Taking orders for pork halves and wholes as well as lamb halves and wholes. Pork half is about three wine boxes and half lamb is about one. They will be ready in the fall and can be custom cut.

Chicken dry rub: you can either put the rub on at home and keep in a zip lock bag or mix it and put it on before grilling (or baking or frying). Mix 1tsp paprika, 1 tsp cumin, 1 tsp onion powder, 1\2 tsp garlic powder, 1\4 black pepper, 1\2 tsp seasoning salt and 1/8 cayenne powder (optional). Brush chicken with olive oil or even just pat on dry. Does enough for two chicken breasts or similar. Adjust spices to your own personal taste.

I am pleased to report that registration is now at 78% of capacity in the Learn to Sail program and will likely exceed 80% with a few late registrations coming in. In the racing program we have 77% of capacity with the Opti program being one short of full and the double handed program being completely full. The only drop in registrations has been in the Laser program where there have been only two sailors registered. This represents an improvement over last year which was at 70% of capacity.

The club was successful in getting a Sports Oakville grant for \$3000 which has been spent on two sets of white sails for C420s and one racing sail for an Opti. This means that all of our charter boat sails have been replaced.

Our programs started on Monday July 2nd and all the coaches have been doing a great job. We thank the members, volunteers, and staff for helping us in the success of the program.

#### **David Johannesson Salmon Recipe**

(this is the delicious Salmon Recipe from the 2018 Sailpast dinner – thank you to David)

It is very simple, and I learned it from Julia Child/Jacques Pepin. We did large filets, for a big crowd, but the recipe is French, for Salmon en Papilotte, which works beautifully with individual size filets.

Take a piece of Parchment paper for each single filet, (foil works for the bigger ones like we did), brush a bit of butter or olive oil in the middle, and lay the filet on it. Chop shallots, tomato, and parsley, and sprinkle on top of the salmon. Drizzle a bit of olive oil on top, and season with sea salt and fresh cracked pepper. Then, take the parchment and fold it to seal, but make sure it's not tight to the fish, i.e. create a little "house". Fasten with pins, or in my case I just staple it (if you use foil, the same applies for leaving room, but you can scrunch together without pins). Cook in a 400-degree oven, 20-30 minutes, depending on thickness of the fish. Check one for doneness. It's pretty hard to overdo, because the tomatoes will keep everything juicy. When ready, plate it in the parchment with whatever you're serving with it, then come around to each place, cut one end of the parchment, and pull it away. The fish will slide onto the plate, the aromas will swirl, and you guests will go "ahhhhh!". If you don't want the extra bother, you can just apply the same process to one large filet in foil and cut out individual servings like we did on Saturday (at Sailpast). Works on the BBQ as well but watch the heat.

Despite the weather being not so co-operative our 41st VIP Week went very well. Skippers, crew, volunteers and of course VIPs made the week a huge success.

We had rain, no wind, high wind and East wind but managed to squeak in a few days of great sailing.

# Transport Canada Small Vessel Regulations have changed – are you up to date?

Here is a list of the changes to the Transport Canada Regulations came, effective May 16, 2018, make sure you are compliant.

- 1. A Pleasure Craft License is now valid for a period of ten (10) years beginning on the day on which it is issued, transferred or renewed. (you can apply online and it is free!)
- 2. Regarding Safety Equipment Carriage, Lifesaving Appliances:

Paddleboats, Water cycles, Stand-Up Paddleboards and Sealed-Hull, Sit-On-Top Kayaks. If every person on board a paddleboat, a water cycle, a stand-up paddle board or a sealed-hull, sit-on-top kayak is wearing a personal flotation device (PFD) or lifejacket of an appropriate size, the paddleboat, water cycle, stand-up paddleboard or sealed-hull, sit-on-top kayak is required to carry on board only the following safety equipment:

- a) a sound signalling device: and
- b) a watertight flashlight, if the paddleboat, water cycle, stand-up paddleboard or sealed-hull, sit-on-top kayak is operated after sunset or before sunrise or in periods of restricted visibility.

Human powered pleasure craft is more than six (6) meters in length, a watertight flashlight and six (6) pyrotechnic distress signals, not more than two (2) of which are smoke signals are required.

#### 3. Visual Signals:

Sail and Power boats up to six (6) meters in length, if the boat is equipped with a motor: a watertight flashlight OR three (3) pyrotechnic distress signals, not more than one (1) of which is a smoke signal.

Pleasure craft more than six (6) meters in length and up to twelve (12) meters in length, the number of pyrotechnic distress signals referred to below may be reduced up to a maximum of 50%, provided the number of smoke signals does not exceed 50% of the permitted number of smoke signals, if the pleasure craft is equipped with:

- a) A means of two way radio communication which can include a cell phone. If a VHF marine band radio then the operator requires a Restricted Operator Certificate (Maritime) (ROC(M); or
- b) A 406 MHz personal locator beacon, that is the subject to the technical acceptance certificate, worn by the pleasure craft operator; or

#### **Transport Canada (continued)**

c) A 406 MHz emergency position-indicating beacon.

For Sail and Power boats over six (6) meters in length and up to nine (9) in length: three (3) pyrotechnic distress signals, not more than one (1) of which is a smoke signal.

For Sail and Power boats over nine (9) meters in length and up to twelve (12) meters in length: six (6) pyrotechnic distress signals not more than two (2) of which are smoke signals.
