Haul-out is scheduled to take place on Saturday, October 20, 2018 and Sunday, October 21, 2018. Haul-out and Storing applications are available in the Clubhouse as well as on-line. Work party signup sheets will be going up on the downstairs noticeboard around October 4, 2018.

Cradle layout will take place in the late afternoon on October 10, 2018 and October 11, 2018. Please let me know if you are helping with this or put your name down on the signup sheet, which will also be posted on the downstairs noticeboard around October 4, 2018. Please schedule any repairs to your cradle requires to take place between October 11, 2018 and October 18, 2018. Make sure your name, your boat's name as well as the "stern" and "bow" ends of the cradle is clearly marked. Remember to erect your cradle by October 19, 2018 but only insert your pads on the day that you are scheduled to be hauled out.

I would like to remind those members who intend to compete in the Die-hards Regatta and who have their masts un-stepped by the Town, to make a mast un-stepping reservation right away with the Town for either the 15th or the 16th of October as the Harbour staff will be hauling out boats at the Oakville harbour on the 17th, 18th and 19th of October. As a result, no work will be taking place in the Bronte harbour yard.

We will be re-grading the parking lot during the day on October 10, 2018. This is overdue, and we are only getting one shot at this. Please make sure that you don't have a car, boat, trailer, etc. parked in the parking lot on that day as we will only have this opportunity on that day.

Fortunately the weather was good for sitting at picnic tables, but still it was stressful for all. Many thanks to Sharon Hyde for keeping things going upstairs, and to Dan Lafferriere and Stephen Firth for pitching in to help on the lower level!

To keep this from happening again, how the club house is booked is changing. Gone will be the schedule in a binder behind the bar, and instead members and Directors who wish to book the club house need only email reservation@bhyc.on.ca and our friendly House Manager, Peter Howard, will respond and take care of you. The club website's calendar will show all club house bookings and external rentals. It will take couple weeks to get fully implemented, but multiple bookings at the same time should soon become a thing of the past.

Safety is paramount to the club, and I noticed we have a very nice automated external defibrillator (AED) behind the bar (that thing on the wall that can restart your heart).

Most members don't know how to use it, so the Club arranged AED training on November 3rd as well as CPR and emergency first aid. Taught by a certified Red Cross partner, the group discount keeps the cost to only \$75 + HST per person. At the end you will get a Class C certification which covers adult, child and infant resuscitation. Attendance is limited, but some spots are still available as I write this article. Just ask at the bar to book yourself... or your buddy, so they can save your life one day!

Rear Commodore Training

The racing program is now over as far as regattas are concerned but the teams will continue to train on Saturdays as long as the weather holds which in the past has sometimes allowed sailing in November to these hardy souls! The club has purchased another C420, this time a used one which comes with a lot of ancillary equipment and, depending on the enrollment in the racing program next year, we may be moving one or two of the older racing boats to the Learn to Sail program and retiring the oldest Learn to Sail boat which are now 14 years old.

A work part was held on the morning of the 29th September to put away all the Learn to Sail boats that are still in the yard and the coach boats other than those required for the continuing training.

I attended the meeting of the Working Group, lead by Mark Gilespie of Etobicoke Yacht Club which is trying to get the Ontario Sailing Association (OSA) to make it easier both in cost and time for young sailors to qualify themselves as instructors. The group has come up with numerous suggestions that will be presented to the OSA on the 18th of October and I expect to be at that meeting and be able to report the outcome to the membership in the November Signal
